



Cinetopia Progress Ridge 14 to open Friday in Beaverton

Cinetopia Progress Ridge 14 plans to open Friday in Beaverton, just in time for the release of Disney-Pixar's "Cars 2."

The 50,000-square-foot movie theater -- "Cinetopia 2.0," as owner Rudyard Coltman says -- offers more entertainment choices than the first location, the Millplain 8 complex in Vancouver.

The \$15 million Beaverton location, which created 140 jobs, will feature iPad menus with pictures of menu items and movie trailers. In two weeks, moviegoers may also reserve seats from an online chart when they buy tickets, a feature not yet available at the Vancouver site.

Cinetopia Progress Ridge 14 also features mega-sized screens, themed movie parlors and "living room" theaters that provide food, beer, wine and live pre-shows. Other entertainment includes a restaurant, wine bar, art gallery and live music. The theater will have two of the largest auditoriums in the Portland area with 61- and 70-foot screens, respectively, Coltman said.

This Cinetopia joins two other anchors of **Progress Ridge TownSquare**, a \$60 million project by Gramor Development: **Big Al's** and the expected 41,000-square-foot **New Seasons Market**, set to open in September.

Businesses soon opening there include Ava Roasteria, B.J. Willy's Woodfired Pizza and Cafe, Mango Tango Frozen Yogurt and Asian Cuisine Express, among 11 others.

Three new tenants, to be announced by Gramor next week, have been confirmed: toy store **Piccolo Mondo**, its second location, Gentle Dental and Play Boutique, all of which are expected to open in the fall.
